

Donegal had the largest narrow-gauge railway network in the British Isles, and operated one of the first railway vehicles with an internal combustion engine in the world. Uniquely, this fascinating museum celebrating Donegal's railway heritage is based in one of the few remaining original station houses, which opened in 1889. The recently refurbished museum comprises of railway rolling stock, including an original 1907 Donegal steam engine, "Drumboe" Ireland's first interactive railway cab for kids big and small.
